#### OCTOBER'S PRESENTATION: AN IN-HOUSE AFFAIR by Barbara Royer

I love browsing in used book stores for old photography books and happened to find "Talking Pictures" by Marvin Heiferman and Carole Kismaric. They asked people to come up with the one picture that mattered most. I loved their idea...and the flash went off in my photographic brain...so, for our October program, we are asking you to take up the challenge! Here is how they explained it:

"We asked people to come up with the one picture that mattered most. The image that seduced, inspired, taught, frightened, amused, offended, obsessed, informed, or provoked him or her. We made it clear that the picture could come from anywhere--from a family album, a movie, an advertisement, television, a newspaper, even from a matchbook. But from all the pictures in the world, we were asking for just one.

We learned quickly that we were asking for a lot. Some people made it clear that what they picked was the picture for now, but if we ask them next year, they might select a different one. Some people took our question as a challenge, others a test, others a game. But when it was time to talk, people did so seriously, and they showed a real commitment to unraveling why they chose one picture over all others.

We never knew how much people would reveal of themselves, how willing they would be to let go, to follow the avenues, associations, and feelings that a picture could provoke. Sometimes the tiniest part of a picture--a detail or a gesture-led to a deeply felt truth or conviction. Every picture turned out to have layers--emotional, intellectual, and social.

...Talking Pictures is a reminder that a single picture has the power to stop us in our tracks and reveal to us just who we are."

Are you up for the challenge? Bring in an image that matters most to you and share why. Second choice can be the image you shot that matters most to you and why.

Emile will take a count of the total number of people who have brought images and divide by the time we have available to show them. That will be the time each will have to share their ideas about the image. The important thing is that the person can talk about the image so we can learn more about each other. Any remaining time will be for comments. How interesting it was to have Bob Harrington regale us last month with his informative discussion, "The Pluses and Minuses of Digital SLRs." Bob's wonderful images, a remark on each page of his presentation, were the frosting on the cake. Bravo!

## MEMBER PROFILE: Jeff Brosbe

Jeff Brosbe's images are fine art photographic prints in extremely limited editions, unique Polaroid manipulations, unique montages of Polaroid manipulations, sometimes augmented with hand coloring, and unique hand colored black & white prints. They are best described, in general, as "Introspective" and often "Impressionistic". He considers the creation of



an image the same as the creation of a Haiku: "It should be whole and meaningful in itself while providing greater insight when pondered further." Jeff does not use digital manipulation of any kind, preferring to use in-camera and hands-on techniques to achieve some unusual effects.

Jeff has had solo exhibitions at the Merced College Art Gallery, San Diego Art Institute, Encinitas Civic Center, Off Track Gallery, The Maturango Museum (Ridgecrest, CA), Fire House Gallery (Grants Pass, OR), College of the Sequoias Art Gallery (Visalia, CA), and Bard Hall Gallery (San Diego, CA). His work has also been exhibited by the La Jolla Art Association, Fine Art Institute of San Bernadino County Museum, McNeese State University (Lake Charles, LA), Irvine Art Center, Florida State Museum of Fine Arts, Palos Verdes Art Center, the Angel's Gate Cultural Center (San Pedro, CA), San Diego Museum of Art, and the Athenaeum Museum and Library of Art and Music (La Jolla, CA). Jeff's work has been exhibited at the San Diego County Fair each year since 1992 and in Photographer's Forum's Annual Best of Photography since 1994, in both cases winning a number of awards.
