MAY'S PROGRAM by Barbara Royer

Our speaker for May is Jennifer George-Walker. Her topic is "How To Push Yourself To Another Level".

While Jennifer George-Walker is relatively new to the field of professional photography, she has already made her presence known by winning awards and presenting programs



on her unique style of photography. She is a member of the Professional Photographers of San Diego County and, in her first year of entering print competition, was awarded Portrait Photographer of the Year in 1999. The following year she won Illustrative Photographer of the Year. She is also a member of Professional Photographers of California and was named the California Photographer of the Year 2000 and also captured the People's Choice Award at the state convention in January, 2001. She joined the Professional Photographers of America in 1999 and began entering prints in competition. In just three years, Jennifer has completed the educational and print merits needed to receive her Master of Photography degree. She is also a Certified Professional Photographer. In 2003, she won both the Grand Premier and First Place awards at the Wedding and Portrait Photographers International convention in Las Vegas.

Jennifer has a very unique style and she will discuss what she does to capture those award-winning expressions with her subjects, as well as how you can find your own style, if you haven't yet defined what it is. She is constantly evolving and trying new ideas in her own work, and will give pointers that will assist us on our own path of creativity. She feels that we, as photographic artists, need to be continually moving and changing so that we challenge ourselves to move to higher levels in our work. You will be sure to come away from her program energized and ready to take your style of photography to a new level.

MIDWAY PHOTO SHOOT by AI Schlegel

We are planning a photo shoot on the USS Midway, 910 N. Harbor Drive by the Embarcadero on Saturday, June 11th. I volunteer as a docent and will be leading our tour of the ship beginning at 0900 AM sharp. We will meet by the ticket booth no later than 0845 and proceed aboard as an early group, so we will have access before the public arrives. The Midway is a great venue for photography and I would suggest that you bring along a flash for the interior shots and a wideangle lens. Midway is just one ship in the adjacent San Diego Maritime Museum featuring the Star of India and other sailing ships.

Unfortunately, the Coaster does not have early service on weekends, so I recommend we car pool and park in the public lot adjacent to the ship. I will be leaving from the Von's parking lot at I-5/Lomas Santa Fe Drive at 8:15 a.m. I have room for six in my van. The general admission is \$13, seniors are \$10 and children 6-17 are \$7. I will collect from you before we board. Please have the correct amount.

Directions to Midway, if you are proceeding independently: Thomas Guide page H, A-6. Take I-5 South to the Airport exit, continue on Kettner and turn right on Hawthorne St., go two blocks to Pacific Hwy. and turn left. Continue past the Embarcadero and look for a "Public Parking" sign by Midway. Turn right into the parking area and proceed to the parking lot on the Navy Pier and park in any numbered space. Parking is \$5 on weekends. Remember the number and enter it when you pay at the parking boxes in the middle of the lot. Place ticket on your dash.
