#### Roy Toft on "Costa Rica's Osa Peninsula"

The Osa Peninsula, near Corcovado National Park, is flanked on one side by the beautiful Golfo Dulce and on the other by the endless Pacific Ocean, offering unparalleled photographic opportunities. Literally teeming with life, the Osa Peninsula is one of the most biologically diverse places in existence, boasting over 400 species of birds (of which 20 are endemic), 117 species of reptiles, and almost 10,000 species of insects. Roy Toft's presentation will display the multitude of species inhabiting most significant remaining rainforest of Costa Rica, and the necessity to preserve (and in some instances re-establish) jungle corridors for select endangered species throughout Costa Rica.



Dedicated to documenting our natural world for future generations, professional photographer Roy Toft is one of the premier wildlife photographers of our generation. With a background in wildlife and conservation biology, Toft chooses to focus solely on wild images that convey a sense of the animal's character and spirit. His images have been featured in *National Geographic, Smithsonian, Audubon, Wildlife Conservation, Discover magazines* and other notable publications to advance conservation efforts globally. As a result, he has been named a founding fellow of the prestig ious *International League of Conservation Photographers (ILCP)*. Toft's striking wildlife images are also available worldwide through the *National Geographic Image Collection* and *Getty Images*. Roy shares his love for teaching & photography by regularly instructing photographic classes, tour groups and workshops in the field. Roy's popular *Rainforests of Costa Rica workshop* was recently filmed for television. The show, *Fine Living Network's Fantasy Camp*, has appeared on T.V. and airline flights. When he is not in the field, Roy offers his popular "*Shoot Like the Pros*" classes from his Gallery in Solana Beach, California. His home office is in the scenic mountainous region of beautiful north county San Diego.

#### **MEMBER PROFILE** by Grant Hulbert



Grant Hulbert was born and raised in San Marcos, where he lives now with his new bride, Aviva, who shares his love of cooking and travel. Because his father taught art at Palomar College, Grant grew up in a household full of creativity, but did not consider himself an artist until he picked up a digital camera a few years ago and discovered a new passion. The first test photo he captured with his Nikon

CoolPix 4500 has been displayed in several venues and has received awards.

Grant's career in computers began at sixteen when he worked for an ocean engineering company, hand-plotting technical graphs until one day he snuck into the computer lab and wrote software to automate his mundane job. At the time, he was afraid he would be reprimanded, but instead he was asked to write even more software; he gladly accepted. He graduated from UCLA with a degree in Computer Science and Engineering. A selfconfessed nerd, Grant has always been attracted to all things technical, including computers, digital cameras, and just about any gadget imaginable.

During his professional experience Grant has authored over 40 commercial software products. He pioneered several new

internet technologies, including the first off-the-shelf eCommerce product, the first database server designed for the web, and the first complete server-side dynamic HTML language. After ushering these products well into their fourth generation, he moved into the color-accuracy side of the printing industry, helping to create products that guarantee perfect matching of color on screen and print.

He is most proud of two inventions: the concept of "Drag and Drop", first used in Kudo Image Browser software, has made computer user interfaces easier to use since the early 1990s, and "WebDNA", a computer language that makes web sites easier to build. His car license plate "WebDNA", surrounded by a frame that reads "Paid for by Macintosh", declares his appreciation for Apple products that have been a mainstay of his 25-year-long career.

His best photos tend to be extreme close-ups of flowers and other small natural objects that become somewhat abstract when viewed from macro-lens distance. While co-teaching nature photography workshops with his mother at their church, his number one tip is, "Get in close, take a picture, then get in even closer and take another". Because he has not been trained in photography, he sometimes calls his close-up nature photos "cheating", because nature has already done all the work of designing and coloring a beautiful composition. With training, he would very much like to graduate from "lucky" to "consistent" photographer!

Grant is consistently excited about NCPS, and looks forward to the camaraderie and learning from the pros at every meeting. If it weren't for the advent of digital cameras, Grant would not be taking photographs today: he is attracted to the technical 'gadgetfactor' as well as instant feedback and lack of photo lab fees! This summer he hopes to take photos in the style of Andy Goldsworthy while attending his parent's 50th wedding anniversary in Montana's Glacier National Park.

#### MEMBER SHARE by Barbara Swanson

The membershare topic for August is Landscapes. Please bring in one or two images to share.

Landscapes are so popular for photographers that they don't need an introduction, but I've included a few thoughts about them. Scenery is the subject in landscapes, and generally people or animals are not included. However, people or animals can add a sense of scale, and show how they fit into the environment.

Sometimes landscapes are divided into three general categories: representational, impressionistic and abstract. Representational is probably the most common, with an emphasis on composition, lighting and weather conditions. Impressionistic shows the landscape as more vague or elusive, and abstract emphasizes shape and form.

Placement of the horizon is very important. The horizon is usually placed above or below the midpoint of the picture. Sometimes a horizon near the top or bottom edge can add drama to a picture.
