JANUARY PROGRAM (Jan 26, 2011)

Mike McMahon: Video...from the Perspective of a Still Photographer

The presentation will address questions that you may have about video. Is it for me? Can I get good results with my existing camera and computer equipment? Can I use it to display my still photography in high definition on my big-screen TV? Is it easy to make DVD movies? What does it take to post videos on websites like You Tube and Vimeo?

Starting from a foundation in still photography, Mike decided to give video a try several years ago. It started with a project to convert many hours of family camcorder movies to DVD. He then experimented with video productions of his still photography, set to music. Simple documentary

work soon followed. His video of the NCPS Photo Shoot at the Batiquitos Lagoon in 2007 included video footage of the event and photos by our members. In the past two years, he has produced professional wedding and family history videos. He has contributed to programs seen on Oceanside's Community TV station, KOCT.

Along the way, Mike has learned many lessons about the world of video. He will share those experiences with us and encourage us to give it a try for ourselves. He will create a short video during the presentation. A member of the NCPS since 2002, Mike served as our club president from 2003 to 2006. He has been involved with the team that produced our Annual Member Show for the past 6 years and has managed our relationship with our club sponsors since 2004.

Mike does volunteer work with several groups in

our community. He shoots the cast photos for local theater groups and volunteers at the Carlsbad Senior Center's PC Lab. He provides free tech help at two local retirement residences. Beginning in February, Mike will teach two courses in digital photography at the Carlsbad Senior Center and at the Encinitas Library. January Member Share: Celebrations

The reason many people take photographs is to record and preserve happy memories. Family albums are often full of images that remind us of good times with loved ones. Celebrations seemed to be a very fitting topic for this month's member share. Not only are we celebrating the arrival of a new year, we can also look back on the 2010 holiday season. Celebrations of course include the "big" holidays (Thanksgiving, Christmas, Hanukah...), but also weddings, birthdays, as well as personal successes and achievements, or fortuitous events. Celebrations can be loud and boisterous, or quiet and poignant. Usually it is fairly predictable that photos will be taken at these events and so the camera records these celebratory rituals.

The camera does more than just record the event. It creates a reflection of what the photographer chooses to see and so the photograph becomes a statement about his/her perception of the moment. Through the photographers' eyes we conjure up memories of past years and past celebrations. Whether the image is a snapshot or carefully composed, it lets the subjects relive the moment and shares the celebration with the viewer.

There are many kinds of celebrations and as many ways to capture the emotions and events associated with them. The photograph itself can become a celebration of a moment in time. Please share one or two images of a celebration with us.
