Most of my early images were family shots and the occasional vacation. Then in 2000 I picked up my first digital camera and a whole new world "developed" in front of my eyes.

This new method of photography allowed me to preserve

and present to others the images that form within my mind's eye, instantly. I've found that digital capture meets my personal needs and Adobe Photoshop functions perfectly as a 21st century darkroom.



In the last few years, equipment and technology advances have made it so that I find my pigment on paper images can possess the same clarity, depth, contrast and longevity of some of the renowned photographers of the past.
