PRESIDENT'S CORNER by Steve Schlesinger

Many (most? all?) of us find ourselves photographing the same subjects over and over. There is nothing wrong with this. In fact, it improves our skill and art in our specialty areas. Recently, I had a chance to photo "outside the box," when I took a workshop in macro/close-up photography. Being primarily a landscape photographer, I viewed this as both "too hard" because you had to deal with control of your lighting and not as interesting as exploring the glorious outdoors in national parks and other areas of scenic beauty. It had seemed to me that you would spend too much time arranging your lighting, subject and background. Also, I had thought I'd rather take a hike than be stuck inside.

As it turns out, there is more similarity than differences from scenic photography, and experience with still life close-ups will improve your ability in scenic or other types of photography. The rules of good composition (and places to break them) apply to both. Having control of your subject matter lets you focus (no pun intended) on composition in a different way than you would when finding the best position and angle on a great scenic. You no longer have the excuse that you couldn't get to the best place for the shot. This reinforces your ability to find good compositions in the field instinctually.

The best light makes the best image. In the field we either spend a very long time waiting for optimal lighting, or capture our image in ordinary light and move on. When we control our own lighting, we are only limited by our own patience in adjusting and readjusting until we are satisfied.

Also, consider how much time and money we spend to get to a beautiful scenic place. None of that in studio close-ups. Even the cost of a simple lighting setup is far less than a trip almost anywhere. My message here (if there even is one), is to try something new, whether it is a close up, a still life or something else.
