Mobile Photography Creating Art with Smartphones Robin Robertis with Jack Davis

Robin Robertis, an Encinitas native, travels the world to capture unique and emotionally compelling images with her



iPhone and then uses a variety of mobile apps to create her award-winning finished work, showcased in international publications and exhibitions from New York to Florence. As a recognized artist in the field of mobile imagery, she

creates artwork that invokes deep magical places found only in the unconscious dreams of those who dare to peek behind the curtain of day-to-day life.



She studied digital image artistry with Photoshop Guru Jack Davis, photography with National Geographic's Dewitt Jones and Rikki Cooke and iPhoneography with Rad Drew. Through digital and traditional art mediums, Robin has explored a variety of themes and styles. Her iPhone

photography has won online acclaim and her recent works have shown in Los Angeles, San Diego, New York, Boston, Kansas City, Toronto, Ontario, and Florence, Italy.

September: Contrast

Thanks to all who participated in our Member Share topic: Reflections! The submissions included the traditional reflections in water, the use of reflective surfaces and some unusual reflections of our photographers encapsulated in the image. Seeing your interpretations of the given topic is always inspiring, especially if you went out and shot for the theme. This month's theme is Contrast. Contrast, by definition, is a difference. You have the artistic choice to emphasize or minimize differences in lighting and color. High tonal contrast photos are primarily light and dark or white and black elements with a sharp difference between them. They are dramatic and strong. Your own contrast could also be related to color and lighting, or might be the items/colors/composition which we don't normally expect to go together. So head out with camera in hand and discover the world of contrasts. Submit two images through the website for this month's theme. October: The Lucky Shot!



UPCOMING PHOTO SHOOT! Techatticup Mine Photo Shoot Date: Wednesday & Thursday October 7 & 8, 2015 Location: Nelson, Nevada

Tom Scott will be leading this fantastic photo shoot to the Techatticup Mine and Nelson ghost town. A boom town in the mid to late 1800s, the mine was later abandoned leaving behind miles of tunnels and countless deteriorating buildings. nelson-Nevada to learn more. Historic tours through portions of the mines take visitors up to 500 feet into the hills. If we get 4 or more members to go, the cost for 8 hours of photography plus the tour would be reduced from \$92 to \$52 each. Plus, Tom is offering to take 3 members in his own car.

The current itinerary is to leave around 6:00 a.m., so we'd get there just before noon. The drive is about 5-1/2 hours each way. There's a motel in Searchlight; nothing fancy, but it has AC. The cost is about \$35 a night. We'll stop in Searchlight just to confirm the reservation, then proceed to Techatticup and wander around until the mine tour starts at 2:00 p.m. After that, we can roam around for 3 more hours or so. The next morning, we'll return around 8:00 a.m. As long as we're very quiet, it should be okay. We should get in around 4 more hours of photography before we head for home.
