Interested in entering the International Exhibition of Photography at the San Diego County Fair? Join us to learn everything you need to know to enter, what is new for 2018 and have your questions answered by the curator himself, Gene Wild and his assistant curator, Lois Fong-Sakai.

Gene and Lois will spend the first half hour discussing the categories, the regulations, the judging process and how to process and present your images to maximize your chances of being accepted through both rounds of judging.

The remainder of the meeting will be a critique session by Gene and Lois. You can get personal tips on how to make your image the best it can be, and grab the attention of the judges.

The image critique will be limited to 1 image per member. Please use the standard submission process for Member Share.

President's Corner 'Image Presentation'

With the San Diego County Fair Photography Competition right around the corner, and so many other opportunities to show off your work, this month is a great time to review image presentation. Why image presentation? Because, as a judge I see many images that could benefit from a little elbow work, or at least some extra care to progress to the next level.

Since the inception of digital cameras, my workflow (at the very minimum) has been to 1st clean dust spots, 2nd add a bit of contrast and 3rd make sure the white balance is correct. Most of you may do this already so you are ahead of the game. Those of you who would like to learn post-processing can find YouTube videos, take a workshop or attend one of Mike McMahon's free classes!

Next, you'll need to take care printing. If you print your own, and know what you are doing, bravo! If you are not sure, hire someone. I do not print any of my work. Learning the art of printing is a whole other ball game and one I don't have time for. I use a trusted online lab and/or local printer with whom I have a working relationship.

What you do with your print now is up to you. If entering it in a competition, <u>read the rules</u> ... carefully. Entries that win a contest are the ones that adhere to the rules. Judges will disregard images with an unnatural colorcast, unprofessional mounting (you know, when the image starts to ripple away from the mount board), the wrong size, and for many more reasons (which could make up another article).

Here are a few more tips to motivate you in the right direction:

_Prepare in advance, in case something goes wrong. Your print's too dark or light? Order a reprint! **_If mounting**, use a professional adhesive NOT Elmer's glue (reference above).

_lf matting, purchase a pre-cut mat from a professional. DO NOT cut your own if you don't have the equipment. You can buy them online, from a framer or at your local craft store. Sharp corners count! **_lf framing**, CLEAN your glass and make sure it is free of lint. DO NOT use an image that has been hanging in your home for years **without thoroughly cleaning it first**. Take it apart and clean the space between the glass and print. Then using backing paper to help keep lint out in the first place.

A professional looking piece will get the judge's attention. And start thinking about our member show now. That will give you plenty of time to prepare and create a stunning entry that you can be proud of. All the best!




encouragement. My first show displayed images from Point Lobos, CA. At that time I had no thoughts of becoming a California resident.





How Did You Get That Shot? by Robert Conrad



Leaving Moab in the dark at 5:00 a.m., my wife and I ventured out to Utah's dramatic Canyonlands National Park in hopes of capturing a sunrise at the famous Mesa Arch. Traveling on a weekday in late October I assured her that we would see a few tripods out there but that it shouldn't be too crowded. That turned out to be my worst assumption of the year!

Quickly traversing the quarter-mile trail to the arch, we came over the final small hill and saw a scene that stopped me dead in my tracks. There was the arch, barely visible behind a crowd of at least 35 people standing shoulder-to-shoulder across the front of the arch. Oh my god! I felt defeated.

Counting on sheer luck, I paced back and forth across this phalanx of photographers looking for a small opening. A group of young Chinese girls scampered about with cell phones, chattering with one another loudly. When one suddenly got up and left her crouched position I literally dove into her spot, abandoning my tripod, lying on my stomach. I slid forward as close as I dared to the edge of the cliff in order to clear my frame of people, backpacks, water bottles, tripod legs, camera bags, etc.



"What a zoo!," I said to myself. People of all ages, most with cell phones. Cell phones! I felt incredulous. Suddenly I hated social media. But, my conscience soon whispered, "It's a national park, world-renown, and it belongs to everyone, not just you and a few guys with tripods." Yeah. I felt like a scolded child.

In the end, I accomplished a

good capture, just what I had hoped for. For you technophiles, I shot camera RAW with a Canon 5D MkIII, using a Canon 17-40mm wide angle zoom. I adjusted the RAW file in Photoshop, and tried a little luminosity masking to control the contrast.

(Note to self: Next time, arrive at 4:00 a.m.!)


